NSO will play *Nuages* and *Fêtes*, two of Debussy's beautiful and atmospheric *Nocturnes*, a key work that helped establish him as a groundbreaking composer at the start of the 20th century.


Richard Strauss's Four Last Songs was written right at the end of his long life and is the perfect summation of a glorious career. The Four Last Songs are a peaceful reflection on old age, written for female singer and orchestra, and remain among his most beloved compositions.

The guest soloist for this concert will be the talented and experienced performer Nina Bennet (pictured below).



The season ends in spectacular style with Ravel's brilliant orchestration of Mussorgsky's multi-faceted piano work *Pictures* At An Exhibition, starting with the famous Promenade and concluding with the epic Great Gate of Kiev.
